Expectations for Commencement.

- Caps are to be worn straight.
- No chewing gum
- Tassel on right hand side
- Boys will remove caps during the National Anthem and the school Alma Mater.
- Please do not throw your caps in the air.
- Be prepared to sing the school Alma Mater (words will be printed in book for you)
- Diplomas may be picked up at the cafeteria after Commencement until 9 p.m.

Dress for Boys:

- Standard white dress shirt with collar.
- Regular necktie or bow ties
- Dark socks and dark shoes (no sneakers, sandals or flip flops).
- Dark trousers or slacks (no shorts).

Dress for Girls:

- Appropriate dress or slacks. (no shorts).
- Dress shoes (no clogs or flip flops). Flats recommended.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Locker Clean Out

All lockers must be cleaned during the special extended homeroom period scheduled for May 20th. All writing, decals, pictures, etc. must be removed. You may keep your textbooks for finals only in your locker after clean out. Your homeroom teacher will check your locker and clear you of this obligation.

Obligations

Payment for obligations must be given to Mrs. Myers in the guidance office. Checks should be made payable to Susquehannock High School. Textbooks may not be handed in at the office, but rather to the teachers who issued them (please hand book to the teacher in person). Mrs. Corrieri must clear all library obligations. All obligations must be cleared by May 29 in order to participate in the commencement ceremony.

Commencement Tickets

All seniors participating in commencement must complete the exit survey which they can find on Naviance(see Survey Instructions on right hand side to access the survey). There will be no outdoor tickets; anyone can come to the outdoor ceremony, or sit in the auditorium if it rains. Seniors will receive 5 indoor tickets for the gymnasium if it rains. Tickets will be handed to seniors once the senior turns in his or her Chromebook to the library.

Medals and Honor Cords

Cords/NHS Stoles will be handed out at the senior meeting on May 16th at 9:45am. Students will be awarded medals on May 15th and are encouraged to wear them to commencement.

Summer School/Correspondence

Summer school/correspondence course is an option for some students in order to satisfy credit requirements for graduation. If a course is not available in summer school, a correspondence course may be an alternative. On May 29th, counselors will notify students who are not eligible to graduate. Your counselor will be able to advise you on whether summer school or a correspondence course is a viable option for you.

Transcripts/Final Grades

Seniors are reminded to notify Mrs. Wittie in the guidance office as to where any final transcript needs to be sent. Transcript request cards are available in the counseling office for this purpose. Final grades, which will appear on the final transcripts, will not be determined until the end of the 4th marking period.

Chromebook Return
