## **American Business Women's Association (ABWA) – (deadline April 15, 2019)**

This \$2000 scholarship is for any female student who will be attending accredited U.S. colleges, university and community/vocational schools. Applicants must be citizens of the U.S.; residents of Cumberland, Dauphin, Perry or York County entering college in August 2019 and attending college with a GPA of 2.8 or higher and should have a history of volunteerism and community involvement. ## **ASHE Engineering Scholarship – (deadline is April 5, 2019)**

This \$2,000 scholarship is for any high school senior or college student who is a U.S. citizen and is considering an engineering career. More information, including an application, is available in the counseling office or by visiting <http://www.harrisburg.ashe.pro/Scholarship.htm>.

## **Dave Brown Memorial Scholarship – (deadline is April 15, 2019)**

Applicants must be seeking a career in the field of music. Applicants must have primary residence in York County, PA, a minimum GPA of 2.5, and must be accepted as a full time student at an academic, vocational or technical school for post-secondary studies in the field of music. Two \$1000 scholarships will be awarded. More information, including an application, is available in the counseling office.

## **B. Davis Scholarship – (deadline is May 24, 2019)**

This \$1,000 scholarship is for high school juniors and seniors, as well as all students currently registered in any post-secondary institution. An essay of less than 1,000 words on a topic is required. For more information, please visit <http://www.studentawardsearch.com/scholarships.htm>.

## **Central Pennsylvania Chapter of ASHRAE – (deadline is April 2, 2019)**

Two \$1,000 scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors pursuing a professional degree or post high school vocational training leading to a career in a field related to heating, refrigeration or air-conditioning of buildings. **Conewago Charitable Foundation – (deadline April 1, 2019)**

Five (5) individual scholarships will be awarded. Each scholarship will be \$20,000 and distributed annually in \$5,000 increments for a maximum of four years. Eligibility includes students planning to major in Accounting, Architecture, Business Management, Construction related Engineering and Construction related majors (as determined by The Conewago Charitable Foundation Committee). Must commit to maintaining a 3.0 GPA throughout the length of the scholarship, demonstrate financial need and attend or live in local area school districts. **Hartman Scholarship – (deadline is May 20, 2019)**

This \$2,500 scholarship is open to any graduating senior who is continuing on to pursue a college degree. Applicants do not need to be a patient at Spark Orthodontics to apply. Must demonstrate leadership and community service. More information, including an application, is available in the counseling office.

**Healthcare Technology Management – (deadline is April 22, 2019)**

Students interested in the career field of technology, IT, or healthcare, may be eligible for this scholarship. In 600 words or less, students are asked to describe what healthcare will be like in 20 years and how technology will be used to improve healthcare. **Jefferson Sportsmen's Association – (deadline is May 10, 2019)**

This is a \$2,000 scholarship available to candidates who are aspiring toward a career in Forestry, Agricultural Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Wildlife Management or a major that pertains to the preservation of our natural resources. **PPL Electric Utilities Future Environmental Leaders Scholarship – (deadline is April 30, 2019)**

**Promoting Future Educators Scholarship – (deadline is April 26, 2019)**

This \$1,000 scholarship is available to any graduating senior from a high school located in Adams, Franklin or York counties. The candidate must have attended the school in the same school district for at least six (6) years. The candidate must be planning to attend a post-secondary training program that certifies that the candidate will work with special education students in the public schools. **Road to Safety Scholarship Contest – (deadline is May 10, 2019)**

Seniors may enter the contest by submitting a creative project that highlights the dangers of drunk driving and/or distracted driving. First place is \$1,000, second place is \$750 and third place is \$500. For complete guidelines of the creative project and application, please visit the counseling office.

**Scott & Hoffnagle Scholarship Fund – (deadline is May 17, 2019)**

Commonwealth Fire Protection Company (CFPC) is sponsoring the Scott & Hoffnagle Scholarship Fund for \$20,000. The funds will be distributed as (1) \$7500, (2) \$5000 and (1) \$2500. These academic scholarships are for those continuing their education in a construction related field with an accredited college/university, community college, or trade/technical school in a 50 mile radius of Leola PA or 25 mile radius of Wilmington DE. The individual must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.50 in the most recent academic year. More information, including an application, is available in the counseling office.

**The 2019 Richard L. Boyd Workers' Memorial Day Essay Contest – (deadline is April 8, 2019)**

Each year the York-Adams County Central Labor Council conducts a \$500 cash scholarship essay contest. Any high school senior living in York or Adams County planning to pursue an accredited post-secondary education is eligible to participate. The essay topic is: 'The Importance of Workplace Safety'. **The Kappa Omicron Sigma (KOS) Alumnae chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority Inc. – (deadline April 13, 2019)**

This organization's primary goal is to provide financial assistance to high school seniors who are continuing their education at a college or university in Pennsylvania. An essay must be written. This year's theme is 'Social Justice' and the topic for the essay is 'Advocating for Social Justice.' More information, including an essay application, is available in the counseling office.

**Walter T. Lightner Memorial Scholarship – (deadline is April 12, 2019)**

High school seniors that have an established NCFCU account may qualify for this scholarship. Must have/maintain at least a 2.5 gpa. An essay is required on the following topic: "Picture yourself working at a Financial Institution. How would you communicate with consumers ages 18-22?" **York Builders Association – Tool Scholarship – (deadline is April 1, 2019)**

High school senior students may be eligible for this scholarship. Students may only apply for one scholarship opportunity with the York Builders Association. Students may only apply for one scholarship opportunity with the York Builders Association. Students already in a post high school course of education or employment are not eligible. They will also work with community partner organizations for a minimum 6 hours per week, paid across all semesters on campus and meet regularly with staff of the Office of Civic Engagement. ## **Bucknell University – Physical Sciences Scholarship**

This scholarship will provide up to \$10,000 annually to students with financial need to help reduce loan and work-study obligations.
