B. Davis Scholarship – (deadline is May 22, 2021)

This \$1,000 scholarship is for high school juniors and seniors, as well as all students currently registered in any post-secondary institution. An essay of less than 1,000 words on a topic is required. For more information, please visit <http://www.studentawardsearch.com/scholarships.htm>.

Career In Teaching Scholarship – (deadline March 31, 2021)

Eligibility includes: a minimum GPA of a 3.0, must graduate from a York County High School in the current year, must be a Pennsylvania resident for one year prior to applying and must be accepted to a Pennsylvania college in a certified teacher preparation curriculum. Selected candidates may be required to attend an interview. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

Dudley & Sylvia Kramer Memorial Scholarship (The ARC of York County) – (deadline is March 2, 2021)

This is a \$1,500 scholarship available to students who are residents of York County, Pennsylvania and are currently working with or have a goal of working with persons with intellectual disabilities. Must show a demonstrated need for tuition assistance. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list. Epilepsy Foundation Western/Central Pennsylvania Scholarship – (deadline is April 1, 2021)

Ten scholarships, totaling \$11,500 will be awarded to graduating high school seniors who have epilepsy/seizure disorder and who are going on to post-secondary school. The three students with the highest total scores will receive a \$1,500 scholarship and the remaining scholarship recipients will receive \$1,000. Applicants must have a diagnosis of epilepsy/seizure disorder, which must be confirmed by a statement from the applicant's physician. Must provide proof of acceptance to a post-secondary academic or vocational program, be a high school graduate of the class of 2021, attend school full-time in the 2021-2022 school year and be a legal resident of Western/Central Pennsylvania. Must attend at least one of the EFWCP's Run Walks in Pittsburgh, Harrisburg, Altoona or Erie. Equitable Excellence – (deadline is December 15, 2020)

High school seniors planning to attend an accredited two-year or four-year college or university in the United States are eligible to receive this \$2,500, \$10,000 or \$25,000 scholarship. Must demonstrate courage, strength and wisdom as shown by community impact through volunteer service. Must be a United States citizen or legal resident living or claiming residency in one of the 50 U.S. states, District of Columbia or Puerto Rico. Gary R. Brown Environmental Scholarship – (deadline is March 29, 2021)

This scholarship is for students pursuing a degree in the field of Environmental Sciences or Environmental Engineering. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and currently be enrolled in a regionally accredited college or university. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list. Great Valu Scholarship – (deadline is March 1, 2021)

A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior planning to enroll no later than the fall semester following announcement of awards, in a full-time course of study at an accredited two or four year college, university, or vocational/technical school in the United States. Must maintain at least a cumulative 3.0 GPA and be a full-time resident of the Great Valu marketing area. Please visit your local Great Value store for an application located at customer service.

High School Oratorical Scholarship Program – (deadline is December 6, 2020)

This contest will consist of two parts: an 8 to 10 minute memorized oration on some phase of the United States Constitution and a 3 to 5-minute oration on one of four “assigned topics” selected by the National Organization. These four topics can be found at <https://www.legion.org/oratorical/topics>. Any student entering the competition must be under the age of 20 years on the date of the National Contest. Must be presently enrolled in a high school or junior high school (public, parochial, military, cyber, private or home school), commencing with grade nine and terminating with grade twelve, during the time of participation at any level of the contest and live in or attend school in Pennsylvania. Awards are as follows:

Department Winner: \$7,500 scholarship, plaque and all-expense-paid trip to the Department of Pennsylvania State Convention to deliver his or her winning prepared oration, plus the opportunity to represent Pennsylvania at the National Contest and receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship from the National Organization.

Department First Runner-up: \$5,000 scholarship and plaque.

Second Runner-up: \$4,000 scholarship and plaque.

H.O.P.E – Jeanette Cartwright Memorial Scholarship – (deadline is March 15, 2021)

High school seniors pursuing post-secondary education who not only demonstrate exemplary academic and extracurricular talent, but continue to do so through the lingering effects of their families' cancer journey, are eligible for this scholarship. Must be a current high school senior who has an immediate family member diagnosed with cancer or one who has recently lost a family member to cancer. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

How Can Bullying Be Prevented Essay Contest – (deadline is February 5, 2021)

Students enrolled in grades 6 through 8 in a public, private, parochial, cyber charter school or who is home schooled in Pennsylvania is eligible to participate. All essays must be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words. Optimist International Essay Contest – (deadline is December 3, 2020)

This essay contest is open to all students under age 19 and must contain at least 700 words, but no more than 800 words. The topic is "Reaching Your Dreams by Choosing Optimism". First place will be awarded \$500, second place will be awarded \$250 and third place will be awarded \$125. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

PB & J Scholarship – (deadline is May 31, 2021)

This scholarship is for high school seniors whose GPA and test scores are on the lower end, but has the drive to succeed. High school seniors planning on attending a two or four year college in the fall of 2020, may be eligible for this \$500 - \$1,000 scholarship. Pennsylvania American Legion 86th Annual Essay Contest – (deadline is January 9, 2021)

Any student enrolled in grades 9 through 12 in a public, private or parochial, cyber school or who is home schooled in Pennsylvania is eligible to participate. All essays must be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words. Awards are as follows:

First Place Winner: Awarded \$3,500, a plaque and a trip to the PA American Legion Convention in July to read the winning essay to the assembled delegates.

Second Place Winner: \$3,000 and a plaque

Third Place Winner: \$2,500 and a plaque

An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

PSECU Scholarship – (deadline is February 26, 2021)

To qualify for one of six scholarships, each awarded for up to \$8,000 (up to \$2,000 per year, up to four years), the student must be a PSECU member by December 31, 2020. Members can access the application at psecu.com/scholarships. During the application process, students will be prompted to enter their school counselor's email address. All applications must be submitted by 12 p.m. (noon) ET on February 26, 2021.

Ron Brown Scholarship – (Deadline is January 9, 2021)

The Ron Brown Scholar Program offers a scholarship of \$10,000 annually for four years, for a total of \$40,000 to 20 or more African American high school seniors each year based on academic excellence and commitment to public service. Recipients may use the renewable scholarships to attend an accredited four-year college or university of their choice within the United States and are not limited to any specific field or career objective. Must excel academically, exhibit exceptional leadership potential, participate in community service activities, demonstrate financial need and be a U.S. citizen or hold a permanent resident visa card. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

The Central PA Chapter of the Women's Transportation Seminar (WTS) – (deadline is December 11, 2020)

Scholarships are open to female students currently attending high school, trade school, junior college, undergraduate school, or graduate school in Pennsylvania. Any female student who is a U.S. citizen considering a career related to transportation may apply. A one-time scholarship of \$500.00 will be awarded to one female high school senior who participated in the York USA Soccer League during their youth. Must have a minimum of three (3) years or six (6) seasons (fall or spring) of participation in the York USA. York USA – Mick Geisinger Scholarship – (deadline is March 1, 2021)

A one-time scholarship of \$500.00 will be awarded to one male high school senior who participated in the York USA Soccer League during their youth. Gettysburg Second Annual Georges Lieber Essay Contest on Resistance

In 2,000 words students are encouraged to raise questions, single out issues, and identify dilemmas involving resistance. Essays should be developed from the students' point of view and may be biographical, historical, literary, philosophical, psychological, sociological or theological. First prize is \$1,000; second prize is \$500; third prize is \$300 and two honorable mentions will receive \$200 each.
