Beacon Scholarship - (deadline is November 30, 2023)

The Beacon Scholarship for Rural America will award \$1,000 scholarships to ONE winner in the Spring and TWO winners in the Fall semester to graduating high school seniors, current college students or adult learners planning to enroll in an accredited college program during the 2023-2024 academic year. Must reside in a rural area and meet low-income criteria outlined in the terms and conditions. Must be college-bound graduating high school seniors, current college students or adult learners with a GPA of 3.0 or higher (high school or college) who are planning to enroll in an accredited college program. Two letters of recommendations are required. In addition, an essay is required on the following topic:

"How have you shown patriotism through your community involvement?"

Build a Better Future Scholarship - (deadline is April 8, 2024)

Five (5) \$10,000 awards are available for graduating high school seniors attending a US-based university, college, or trade school to continue education. This scholarship is to recognize those students who are actively working on making a difference in their communities. <u>Car Accident Injury Scholarship</u> - (deadline is December 1, 2023)

Current high school seniors and undergraduate college students enrolled or planning to enroll a U.S. college or university and submit their application, with all components, by the deadline, may be eligible. A 700-1400 word essay is required answering the following topic:

Automobile accidents continue to pose a significant threat, particularly for high school and college students. Among the prominent concerns are instances of texting while driving, driving under the influence, reliance on autopilot systems, and overall distracted driving. Delve into a subject akin to the aforementioned themes, exploring the challenges confronted by contemporary drivers, with a specific focus on young adults.

<u>Dudley & Sylvia Kramer Memorial Scholarship (The ARC of York County) – (deadline is March 2, 2024)</u>

This is a \$1,500 scholarship available to students who are residents of York County, Pennsylvania and are currently working with or have a goal of working with persons with intellectual disabilities. Must show a demonstrated need for tuition assistance. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list. Equitable Excellence Scholarship - (deadline is December 18, 2023)

This scholarship supports students from across the country who strive to be a force for good in their communities and beyond. 100 renewable awards of \$5,000 each and up to 100 one-time awards of \$2,500 each will be granted. Current high school seniors planning to enroll full-time in an accredited two - or four-year college or university in the United States for the entire upcoming academic year may be eligible. Must demonstrate financial need and be willing to provide release to publicize their identities and information about their achievements along with photographs for use in Program promotion/information. Greg Hodnett Foundation Scholarship- (deadline is June 3, 2024)

This scholarship will be awarded to a student entering college or a technical school. Must be a current high school senior graduating in 2024 and be enrolled in or pursuing a 2-or 4-year degree beginning in the 2024-2025 school year. Hagan Scholarship - (deadline is April 20, 2024)

This scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship, providing recipients with the opportunity to graduate college debt-free. This scholarship provides up to \$7,500 each semester for up to eight (8) consecutive semesters. Must be a citizen of the United States, have a 3.5 cumulative GPA, enroll at an eligible four-year college or university following high school graduation, must work 240 hours from January 1, 2024 until commencement of the 2024 fall semester in college. H.O.P.E – Jeanette Cartwright Memorial Scholarship – (deadline is March 15, 2024)

High school seniors pursuing post-secondary education who not only demonstrate exemplary academic and extracurricular talent, but continue to do so through the lingering effects of their families' cancer journey, are eligible for this scholarship. Must be a current high school senior who has an immediate family member diagnosed with cancer or one who has recently lost a family member to cancer. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

Randy Rebert Softball Scholarship - (deadline is April 1, 2024)

This annual scholarship will be awarded to one biological female applicant. This scholarship is for \$500 awarded to a senior currently playing high school softball and pursuing a post-high school education that involves continued play in the sport at the college/university level. Must have a minimum GPA of a 2.5, require financial need, be admitted to an accredited 2 - or 4 - year college or university as a full-time student and continue to play in the sport for the entire academic year. An essay and two letters of recommendations are required. SMART Scholarship - (deadline is December 1, 2023)

The Science, Mathematics, and Research for Transformation (SMART) Scholarship-for-Service Program is a combined education and workforce development opportunity for STEM students. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, be a citizen of the United States, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, or United Kingdom at time of application, be 18 years of age or older as of August 1, 2024, requesting at least 1 year of degree funding prior to graduation (which starts at the program start date) and pursuing a technical undergraduate or graduate degree in one of the 24 STEM disciplines listed below:

- Chemistry

Top of the Mountain Memorial Scholarship - (deadline is October 22, 2023)

This scholarship aims to support students who are devoted to making a difference and caring for our environment. High school senior or undergraduate student who has worked, interned, and/or volunteered in environmental causes may be eligible. STEM majors are preferred but not required. Youth Scholarships from the VFW - (deadlines vary, please see below for specific dates)

The VFW and Auxiliary are dedicated to promoting patriotism and investing in our future generations. Three different scholarship are available as indicated below:

Voice of Democracy - (deadline is October 31, 2023):

Students in grades 9-12 are eligible for this audio-essay program that provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regards to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. The national first place winner receives a \$35,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest - (deadline is March 31, 2024):

The Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest recognizes up-and-coming artists and encourages patriotism in youth. Students in grades 9-12 who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Must be a permanent resident or have applied for permanent residence status (that application for which has not been denied) to become a U.S. citizen. The first place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling \$37,000.
