This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student athlete regardless of the sport they participate in or the capacity. This scholarship of \$1500 is for seniors that are members of the 1st Ed Credit Union. Applications will be blindly reviewed by the Scholarship Committee and the Board of Directors. You must be a member of a 1st Ed Credit Union, a high school senior expecting to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program at an accredited 2 or 4 year college/university or a vocational/technical school in the USA. The selection will be based on academic achievements, extracurricular and community activities, and essay. Applicants will be notified of the Board's selection by March 15, 2024. Garden Club of York - (deadline February 29, 2024)

This scholarship of \$1500 is for student pursuing a 4-year degree in Biology (excluding Pre-Med), Horticulture, Landscape Architecture, Conservation, Forestry, Botany, Agronomy, Plant Pathology, Environmental Sciences, Land Management, Wildlife Sciences, Urban/Rural Planning, Agriculture or Floriculture. This scholarship will be awarded to a student entering college or a technical school. Must be a current high school senior graduating in 2024 and be enrolled in or pursuing a 2-or 4-year degree beginning in the 2024-2025 school year. Hagan Scholarship - (deadline is March 1, 2024)

This scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship, providing up to \$7,500 each semester for no more than eight (8) consecutive semesters. Must be a citizen of the United States, have a 3.5 cumulative GPA, enroll at an eligible four-year college or university following high school graduation, must work 240 hours from January 1, 2024 until commencement of the 2024 fall semester in college. H.O.P.E - Jeanette Cartwright Memorial Scholarship - (deadline is March 15, 2024)

High school seniors pursuing post-secondary education who not only demonstrate exemplary academic and extracurricular talent, but continue to do so through the lingering effects of their families' cancer journey, are eligible for this scholarship. Must be a current high school senior who has an immediate family member diagnosed with cancer or one who has recently lost a family member to cancer. An application will be available on Naviance under the colleges tab, scholarships and money drop down menu and then by clicking the scholarship list.

Kelly Law Autism Scholarship - (deadline December 20, 2023)

An applicant must (a) be a citizen of the United States, (b) diagnosed with autism, (c) plan to further their education beyond the secondary school (high school) level. A brief essay (around 100 words) stating the way in which the continuation of your education will further your anticipated career goal is required. We reserve the right to ask you for verification of your ASD diagnosis. The scholarship is in the amount of \$1,000, and it will be made as a direct payment toward the winning applicant's tuition at a post-secondary educational institution. The scholarship may be used for tuition at a college, graduate school, trade (vocational) school, or junior college chosen by the winning applicant. Must have a minimum GPA of a 2.5, require financial need, be admitted to an accredited 2 - or 4 - year college or university as a full-time student and continue to play in the sport for the entire academic year. King Memorial Scholarship - (deadline Jan 31, 2024) PVK Scholarship Knights of Columbus Council #8891 is offering a one-time \$1,000 scholarship in memory of Paul V. King to a graduating senior (or home-school equivalent) in the Class of 2024. Applicants need not be Knights or have a family member who is a Knight, but the applicant's parents must be registered members of St. John the Baptist Parish. Grades, involvement in school, community, and parish activities, and —most important — your response to the listed essay question will determine the scholarship winner. This scholarship ranging from \$10,000 to \$65,000 will be given to more than 600 students nationwide. Open to any student in grades 9 - 12 in a public, private or parochial, cyber school or who is home schooled in PA is eligible to participate. First place winner will be awarded \$3,500, a plaque and a trip to the PA American Legion Convention in July to read the winning essay. Second place winner will receive \$3,000 and a plaque. Drexel University Eagles Fly for Leukemia Scholarship

This Scholarship is awarded annually in affiliation with the Eagles Fly for Leukemia Foundation to an incoming first-year student who is a survivor of childhood cancer. It is a full tuition scholarship and is renewable for future years of a student's undergraduate degree program for the terms they are registered for classes (a total of 12 academic class terms; the scholarship is not available during terms of co-op), provided that they maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA and full-time status. To be considered for Drexel's Eagles Fly for Leukemia Scholarship, applicants must submit a complete admission application by the appropriate deadline and the Eagles Fly for Leukemia supplemental application by November 15 (Early Decision applicants) or February 1 (Early Action and Regular Decision applicants). The supplemental application can be found in your Discover Drexel by selecting the Enrichment & Scholarship Applications tab.
