SCHEDULING

- *Student schedules should be available by the end of the school year.*
- *Schedule changes can be made until June 4th; please contact your student's counselor*



COUNSELOR MEETINGS

- *Counselors will meet with every 9th grade student for a formal meeting.*
- *These “Freshman Meetings” typically occur in October which coincides with end of 1st MP.*

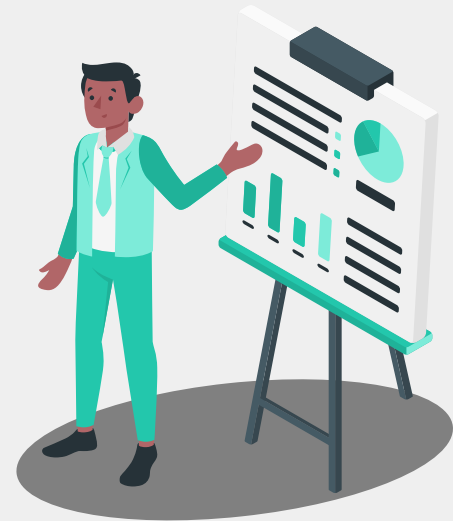


TRANSITION EVENTS

COURSES & ACADEMICS

- *Students can take 7 credits per year.*
 - *Underclassmen are not granted a Study Hall.*
- *Courses are either a full-year or a half-year/semester in length.*
 - *Full-year courses are typically 1.0 credit*
 - *Half-year courses are typically 0.50 credits*

- *Students must earn 25 total credits in order to graduate.*
 - *4 credits of English and Social Studies*
 - *3 credits of Math and Science*
 - *1 full credit of Health and 1 full credit of Physical Education*
 - *1 credit of Career Exploration*
 - *2 credits of Arts and Humanities*
 - *Remaining credits in electives*

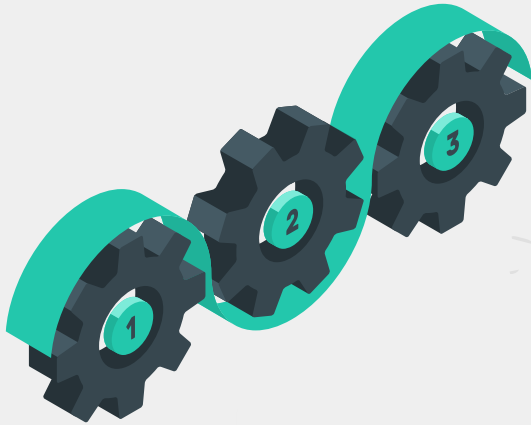


GETTING INVOLVED
